Personally appeared before me, the undersigned, a Notary Public in and for said County, Anson Call and Mary Call, both of Bountiful, in said County, who being by me first duly sworn, depose and say that in the early part of October, A. D. 1857, the late John D. Lee, recently executed for participation in the Mountain Meadows Massacre, called at their residence in Bountiful and remained there overnight, and in the evening the said Lee informed the said Anson and Mary Call of the Massacre at Mountain Meadows of the Arkansas Company of emigrants the previous month, and then and there affirmed that the said massacre was perpetrated by Indians exclusively, and that no white man took part in it.

The said Anson Call further deposes and saith, that he inquired of the said Lee whether he had reported the massacre to President Brigham Young, when said Lee replied that he had so reported it, and, substantially, in the same words as he had used to deponents; and, particularly stated, that he had declared to President Brigham Young that not a single white man had taken part in the massacre.
