Bro Franklin called in having notified Bro
Kerry's folks and told the President ^{the} old man
Kerry, nor his sons did not wish to attend, that
is what he learned from Sister Kerry.

In the evening President Young attended a
meeting at the Historians office to consider the
Doctrines of Orson Pratt as taught in the Peer and
other of his works. Bro Orson Pratt, stated his
views at the meeting and he could not see but,
what his doctrines were based upon the
Revelations of Joseph;

President Young, Bro Taylor, Woodruff Geo a
Smith, Erastus Snow, O. Hyde, came to the conclusion
that Bro Orson ought to retract the erroneous
portions of his doctrine; and publish a sermon
to that effect; this he might do with the assistance
of the twelve; if this was not accomplished with
the doctrines would be submitted to the
general conference;

President Young observed the Confessional
sermon of Bro Pratt; merely stated his \neq views
did not agree with mine and that he ought

to yield his views to President Young. I want him observed the President to say that his views ~~are~~ are contrary to truth and right; his sermon represents me to the world as a tyrant ^{trammelling} ~~trammelling~~ ^{them} ~~to believe~~ as I do right or wrong; it is my calling observed the President to see that right doctrines are taught.

Bro O Hyde asked Bro Orson if he believed Bro Brigham was the man God had called to preside over the Church and Kingdom of God. Bro Pratt said he did believe that; but he also believed that the Prophets ~~and~~ and leaders of every dispensation have been in error on different points, he did not question Bro Brigham's integrity but he did question his judgment in arriving to correct conclusions in some matters of doctrine, in regard to Bro Brigham's policy in government he did not think it could be done better. Bro. Pratt also observed at times he hardly felt he was competent to be an apostle and he left himself entirely in their hands but he could not be hypocrite enough to retract his doctrines when he believed them, neither could he say he could receive doctrines that he could not believe; and if he was desfellowshipped he could not help it.
