Friday 20th I plowed some and help to start my brother cow to drive to the City grubed some brush &c

Saturday 21st I worked on the Canal got our job most completed &c

Sunday 22nd I went to Meeting &c all so in the evening

Monday 23rd it snowed a little Sunday evening to day I went to plow for the Indians all hands turned out to plow we put in 17 acres of wheat They seemed well pleased some of them know how to plow quite well my father went to (p.59) the City and brought the news that one of my brothers little girls was dead she was taken sick Saturday 21 and died on Monday 23 supposed to have been brain fever and by eating poison segoes through Mistake she was 8 years old and her name was Biraina? Farr quite sudden death

Tuesday 24th quite cool in the Morning I went up to Milo Andrus to get his Carriage to go to the City my father and folks went to the City to the funeral &c I grubing brush to day &c

Wednesday 25th I worked at grubing willows my father started for Ogden to help my brother move I worked & in the Afternoon I Layed some land for Irrigation. my Cousin O Badger come down from the City to swap Omen he give his two yoke of steers for my (sic) our one yoke made the the (sic) trade (p. 60)

Thursday 26th I worked at grubing willows in the Afternoon I was Catchiesed by David Brinton Bishop of Big Cottonwood Ward and Milo Andrus Counselor grubed till night went to evening Meeting &c

Friday 27th I worked at grubing in fore part of the day in the After part of the day I went down to the Bishops to be baptised in to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter day Saints by David Brinton Bishop and confirmed a member of the Church of Christ? under the hands of Milo
