EASTERN TELEGRAMS.

Chinese Question-Sargent's Speech Its Object, etc. WASHINGTON, March 7.—Sargent's speech on the Chinese question, to-day, occupied about two hours in its delivery, and, notwithstanding its great length, was listened to with interest by a considerable number of the most prominent Senators.

London, March 8.—A correspondent at Vienna bears, on trustworthy authority, that Roumania will only cede Bessarabia if the Powers consent, but will refuse to receive the Dobruzscha under any circumstances.

LONDON, March 7.—A Paris correspondent says it seems certain that France will readily consent to England's obtaining complete security in regard to the Suez Canal, but would do her utmost to dissuade England from occupying Egypt.

Papal Troubles and Politics. LONDON, March 8.—A dispatch from Rome states that the Swiss Guards of the Vatican on Wednesday demanded their month's pay, usual on the death of a Pope.

The Four Per Cent. Loan. WASHINGTON, March 7.—The Secretary of the Treasury will, until further notice, receive subscriptions for the four per cent. funded loan of the United States at par and accrued interests.

New York, March 7.—The steamer Bolivia arrived to-day. She reports sighting the ship Berthot, of Portland, in distress. She sent a life-boat and

found that Captain Hill and three of his crew had been washed overboard on the previous day during a heavy gale, and the Mate and one seaman injured. He sent an officer and two seamen to navigate the vessel.

Terrible Tumble Three Killed. BALTIMORE, March 7.—The trestle platform used in building the new iron bridge over the Potomac River at Rowell Bond gave way yesterday, precipitating 13 men who were at work into the river, a distance of 50 feet. Three men were killed outright and the remainder were seriously injured.

Bennett's Polar Expedition. WASHINGTON, March 7.—The Senate Committee on Commerce to-day agreed to report a bill complying with James Gordon Bennett's request that the Pandora be allowed to sail under an American flag, and that naval officers be detailed in the proposed Arctic expedition.

The Eight Hour Law. WASHINGTON, March 7.—The House Committee on Education and Labor to-day agreed to report favorably a joint resolution, restricting the eight hour law, and providing that the same be recognized as a day's labor throughout the Government service.

Virginia's Financial Matters. RICHMOND, March 8.—Governor Holliday sent to the Legislature to-day a communication, setting forth in the strongest terms, his sentiment that the State debt should be paid without the suggested Constitutional Convention or other expensive methods.

Trouble With King Humbert's Cabinet. ROME, March 7.—Signor Crispis' resignation probably presages the Cabinet's fall. King Humbert will probably commission Signors Cairoli and Zanaroli to form a new Ministry.
